Fodder & Tipple Trail – Staying Safe

Before you set off, please do read the following information about staying safe:

- This is a ticketed, self-guided trail set out on a detailed written & digital map. All of the trail stops are located on both maps and include small tasters (for ticket holders)
- Before setting off please check that you feel fit and healthy it is your responsibility to ensure that you are able to take part in this trail
- Please wear appropriate walking shoes and comfortable clothing. You may also wish to consider taking a supply of drinking water with you
- Please consider the weather conditions before setting off, you can get an update form a reputable website
- If you have a smart phone, it is advisable to take yours with you in case of an emergency
- In case of inclement weather, please wear appropriate waterproof clothing as there are stretches of the trail where cover is not available. Please note that ground may become slippery due to rainfall please take due care
- Due to the nature of the Fodder & Tipple Trail with alcoholic tasters, the tickets are only available for those 18 and above
- If you are bringing a child on the route, please be aware that it is 2 miles in length
- Please consider using our free 'Wristbands for Lost Children' which are available at the Festival Information Point by the Buttercross on Cheshire Street
- For missing or lost children, who are not wearing a free wrist band, please go to the festival information point located on the High Street in the first instance
- Dogs are welcome on this trail, but owners MUST keep dogs under control and on their leads at all times
- Please stick to the trail route, respect the property and do not trespass on private land
- Please take care when walking alongside the roads and crossing them. Market Drayton is a
 medieval market town and some of the pavements and streets are narrow and uneven. The trail
 also runs along some roads on which traffic will be flowing, so please take due care and attention
 when crossing. Please also use the green cross code and the marked crossing points & pedestrian
 crossings where available
- We have set out alternative accessibility routes avoiding the steps down and up to the Canal on at Betton Bridge, please see map and instructions
- When visiting the Floating market at the canal, please respect the event signage and instructions from event marshals. Please take due care and attention it is every adult's responsibility to ensure their children are supervised at all times
- Please be careful along the tow path by the canal side near to the waters edge
- You must adhere to the current Covid-19 government guidelines.
- St John's Ambulance are on site in the town centre but won't be on the trail. If you have a medical emergency, please call 111 or 999.
